Bronze ROTC Medal

BEFORE starting on your SAR Bronze ROTC Medal Form below, please follow the “Save” instructions.

Use the “Save to Your PC” button. Add the Cadet’s Name to the Saved file Name.

For example, “**Cadet SGT George Compatriot Bronze ROTC Medal.PDF**”.

Now **CLOSE** the web page and **OPEN** the saved File on your PC to Continue.

When you place your mouse over most of the “text” data entry fields below, a feature called a “tooltip” will display as a window/popup to give you additional instructions concerning what should be entered in that field.

“Tooltips” provide important instructions – Please read them carefully.

The SAR Bronze ROTC Medal is approved by the United States Army, the United States Navy, the United States Marine Corps, and the United States Air Force. Each service has notified its JROTC Units of this approval and has authorized presentation to its cadets.

This award may be presented by the National Society, a state society or a chapter to students enrolled in JROTC Programs. The medal endeavors to foster the principle of “citizen-soldier” exemplified by the Minutemen. The SAR Bronze ROTC Medal is presented only to students in secondary school JROTC units. No recipient may receive the Bronze ROTC Medal more than once.

Recipients are selected for a high degree of merit with respect to leadership qualities, military bearing and general excellence. The recipients are selected by the SMI (Senior Military Instructor) of the JROTC unit, who should be given full latitude in making the selection. The criteria for receiving this award is set forth in the parent military service directives to the JROTC Units.) + Cadet must be enrolled in JROTC Program; + 3rd year of a 4 year Program or 2nd year of a 3 year Program (**cadet must be a junior**); + Top 10% of JROTC Class; + Top 25% of his/her Class.

One medal will normally be awarded each year in JROTC units with fewer than 500 cadets. For larger units, one medal may be presented for each 500 students enrolled in the unit. Moreover, where a school has more than one JROTC unit, each unit is counted separately. It is desirable to have the medal on display with its ribbon bar in a trophy case at each school where it is presented. This will serve as an incentive to the students and publicize the SAR JROTC Program as well.

Cadets of the US Navy Sea Cadet Corps (NSCC) are no longer eligible to receive the SAR Bronze ROTC Medal.
